Judging will be performed by a panel of Judges appointed by the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland.

The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971, and to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association, in addition to the Special Regulations which appear in this schedule.

No refunds will be made after close of entry.

No refunds will be given for entries not presented or not adhering to the schedule regulations.

NOTICE TO INTENDING EXHIBITORS

Entries for EKKA can be made either on the Application to Enter Form enclosed with this schedule or online at our website: www.ekka.com.au. Entries submitted other than on the correct form or online will be returned to the Exhibitor and, unless all requirements are complied with and the forms returned to the office by 5.00pm on the Application to Enter closing date, as shown in the Schedule, they will not be considered.

As a condition for acceptance of my entry: Neither myself nor my family members will indulge in any social, professional or other interaction with an official or judge contracted or sub-contracted by the RNA before or during the Royal Queensland Show.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

ENTRY FORMS

Exhibitors must complete "STATEMENT BY EXHIBITOR" section on the front page of the entry form advising their taxation status.

PRIZE MONEY

1. Prize Money stated in the Schedule excludes GST.
2. GST will be added to the Prize Money for Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes. Prize money will be paid into your nominated bank account by 31 October following the Show.
3. The Association will provide a "Recipient Created Tax Invoice" to Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes.
4. All cash prizes and trophies must be claimed within six months from the closing date of the Royal Queensland Show. Prizes not claimed and by that date will be considered to have lapsed, and the amount will become a donation to the Association. (RNA By-Laws)

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

1. The Brisbane Showgrounds are a designated Workplace within the meaning of the Workplace Health and Safety Act 2011 and exhibitors/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control, including their contractors or sub-contractors, comply with all requirements of the Act and the RNA holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor of any area of the Showgrounds.
2. Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family, other exhibitors, RNA staff, show visitors, children and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.
3. Risks identified by exhibitors/competitors will be eliminated or controlled by the exhibitor/competitor and particular attention will be paid to ensuring public safety and safety of other exhibitors/competitors.
4. Exhibits will only be held and handled by competent persons whose experience is known to the exhibitor/competitor.
5. A "No Smoking Policy" will be strictly adhered to and policed by exhibitors/competitors and exhibitors/competitors are advised that the use of Primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of a like character, or any naked light, is strictly prohibited in the pavilions.
6. Any exhibitors/competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. The use of double adaptors is prohibited and all power boards must also be tested and tagged.
7. All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors/competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of noncompliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Royal Queensland Show.
8. The Brisbane Showgrounds is subject to a Special Facility License issued under the Liquor Act 1992 and strict laws related to the consumption and possession of liquor across the Brisbane Showgrounds site. The consumption or possession of liquor outside of the licensed bar areas is not authorized by the RNA and in many cases may be an offence for which on the spot fines can be issued by Police and Liquor Licensing Investigators.

DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

132. It there is any inconsistency between By-laws 133 - 153 and any other By-laws of the Association, By-laws 133 - 153 will prevail.
133. The functions of the Disciplinary Committee shall be to hear and determine all complaints, allegations and other matters relating to:
- a) prohibited substances, as defined in these By-laws or Sectional Regulations.
 - b) any alleged breach of the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association by an exhibitor and relating to an exhibit or to a competition, except if the alleged breach is of a kind that the Chairman of a Sectional Committee considers is of a less serious nature and should properly be dealt with by the Sectional Committee, and
 - c) any other alleged breach of the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Association that may be referred to Disciplinary Committee pursuant to By-Law 137 (a).
147. The Disciplinary Committee may announce its decision orally or in writing. A decision that is announced orally shall have effect in accordance with its terms.
148. If the opinion of the Disciplinary Committee is not unanimous, the decision of the majority shall prevail. If the Disciplinary Committee are equally divided on any question concerning the guilt or innocence of a person, the question shall be resolved in that person's favor.
149. If the Disciplinary Committee considers that there has been a breach of the rules, By-laws or regulations of the Association, it may impose such a penalty as it considers to be appropriate, including without limitation:
- a. a reprimand;
 - b. a monetary fine (payable at such time/s as the Disciplinary Committee may determine);
 - c. withdrawal or withholding of any award or ribbon;
 - d. disqualification in respect of any class;
 - e. expulsion from the Showground;
 - f. where the person concerned is a member, a suspension or termination of that membership;
 - g. a ban;
 - h. exclusion;
 - i. prohibiting a Person from exhibiting or competing at the current Show or at any future Show;
 - j. a direction that an Exhibit be removed from the Showground;
 - k. any other mandatory requirement; and
 - l. any other penalty provided for in other regulations of the Association.
150. There shall be no appeal from any decision of the Disciplinary Committee.

INSURANCE

161. The RNA may (but is not obliged to) take out a policy of insurance in respect of the legal liability on the part of an Exhibitor for loss or damage suffered by a third party caused by any act or omission of an Exhibit or the Exhibitor.
162. The RNA, RNA Staff Members and Officials of the RNA are not liable to any Exhibitor if the RNA fails to take out a policy of insurance effectively protecting any Exhibitor or Exhibit, or if any such policy does not operate to indemnify the Exhibitor in respect of the loss or damage in question.

REGULATIONS & BY-LAWS

All Entries and Exhibitors are subject to RNA Regulations and By-Laws set out in this schedule as well as other By-Laws that may pertain to this competition.

The RNA reserves the right at all times at its absolute discretion without assigning any reason to:

- (a) substitute a Judge when necessary;
- (b) re-allocate Judging days for a particular breed.
- (c) if entries numbers require an extra Judge, appoint an additional Judge if necessary.

Full copies of the RNA By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Competitions Department.

PRIME BEEF REGULATIONS

Subject to the Royal National Agricultural and Industrial Association of Queensland Act 1971 and to the Rules and By-Laws of the Association the following Regulations shall apply.

Judging with the exception of the carcass classes, will commence from 9:00am on Thursday 6 August 2020 in the indoor/outdoor arena at Silverdale Saleyards.

Champion prizes and trophies will be presented to the winning exhibitors as judging progresses throughout the classes on commencement.

CATTLE CANNOT BE ENTERED FOR NOR COMPETE IN MORE THAN ONE CLASS.

Total entries allowed per exhibitor per section are:

- 3 entries - Single classes
- 2 entries - Pen of 3 classes
- 3 entries - Pen of 6 classes

All stock entering the competition must meet the national Bovine Johne's requirements. Exhibitors must advise their Johne's Disease status at the time of entry.

When lodging entries, the NAME of the owner's accredited SELLING AGENT must be stated on the Entry Form.

All cattle are to be for bona fide sale & will be presale live weighed.

After the fall of the hammer, the stock becomes the responsibility of the purchaser in every respect, with the inclusion of feeding if required.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor or his agent to place animals in their correct classes and pens before weighing.

ENTRY FEES

To assist in reducing overall exhibitor costs, the RNA has pre-set all fees for costs relating to the Prime Beef Show and Auction. These costs included:

- Weighing and Scanning
- Yard Fees
- Auction processing fee

JUDGING CRITERIA

1. Cattle will be judged on their ability to meet respective market (Trade or Export) suitability. Consideration will be given to the age and weight of each exhibit.
2. Beef Breeds or Crosses of Beef Breeds only are eligible in this section. In the event of too many entries the RNA reserves the right to limit the number of entries for exhibitors.
3. Exhibitors are requested to state Breed or Crosses of Cattle entered.
4. Grain Fed or Grain Assisted, Pasture Fed or Crop Fed cattle may be entered or exhibited. **Grain fed cattle must be from an accredited feedlot (purple docket must be supplied).**
5. Cattle entered in the Prime Beef Cattle Classes must have been reared on their own mothers.
6. No heifer in calf will be eligible to compete. Any prize awarded to any heifer/cow found, after being sold or killed, to be in calf, shall be forfeited. No bull or stag may compete in any Class.

WEIGHTS

If after weighing at the Saleyards exhibits are too heavy or too light for the class entered, they can be transferred to another class as long as they are within the class weight ranges.

Any entry that is outside the heaviest or lightest section weight range on Thursday morning after weighing will be disqualified and ineligible for competition and will be sold at the Prime Beef Auction.

There will be NO over/under weights. Maximum & minimum weights: Single Classes

Maximum weight - 720kg
Minimum weight - 380kg

Pen of 3 Classes

Maximum weight - 520kg
Minimum weight - 380kg

Pen of 6 Classes

Maximum weight - 720kg
Minimum weight - 400kg

Note: Cattle in Pen Classes cannot be entered for nor compete in Classes for single exhibits.

DENTITION

Only cattle showing not more than four permanent incisors may be exhibited. (Some Classes provide for a lesser number). Whether an exhibit is showing the correct number of teeth shall be subject to determination by the Association's Veterinary Surgeon at the direction of the Council Stewards.

The teeth of all cattle exhibited in the Prime Beef Cattle Section must be examined by the Exhibitor or his agent between 30 June 2020 and prior to the date of arrival on the Saleyards.

EAR TAGS

All prime beef cattle must be ear tagged. Tags will be marked on both sides with the number of the animal or animals comprising an entry which will correspond with the catalogue of entries. The ear tag will be supplied by the Association to each exhibitor after the close of entries.

It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor or his agent to affix the appropriate colored tag to the near ear prior to dispatch to the Saleyards. Each ear tag will indicate the number of permanent incisors erupted. The following colours will be used:
Orange - milk incisors
White - two incisors
Green - four incisors

If the animal shows no permanent incisors or shows no evidence of having had any permanent incisors, an orange ear tag shall be affixed to the near ear. In the case of an animal showing one permanent incisor, it will be eligible only for Classes requiring two permanent incisors.

When the animal is showing no more than two permanent incisors or showing evidence of having had no more than two permanent incisors, a white ear tag shall be affixed to the near ear. When the animal is showing no more than four permanent incisors or showing evidence of having had no more than four permanent incisors, a green tag shall be affixed to the near ear.

Each exhibitor must forward, prior to the penning of his cattle, a Statutory Declaration prepared and supplied by the Association, verifying that the animal has been correctly tagged and mouthed, prior to despatch to the Silverdale Saleyards. A blank statutory declaration will be sent with the ear tags.

NO ANIMAL WILL BE ALLOWED TO BE PENNED IN ANY CLASS UNLESS IT HAS THE APPROPRIATE EAR TAG AND THE OWNER'S STATUTORY DECLARATION HAS BEEN RECEIVED BY THE ASSOCIATION.

In Classes 34, 35, and 36 all cattle exhibited must have the appropriate ear tag placed as set out in the Regulations. See Special Regulations regarding the selling of carcasses from Classes 34, 35, and 36.

All cattle travelling to the Saleyards MUST have an NLIS device applied before leaving property of origin.

BIOSECURITY QUEENSLAND REGULATIONS

All Queenslanders have a 'general biosecurity obligation' (GBO) under Queensland's [Biosecurity Act 2014](#) (PDF, 1.5MB). Not complying with the GBO is an offence.

This means that everyone is responsible for managing biosecurity risks that are:

- under their control and
- known about, or should reasonably be expected to know about.

Under the GBO, individuals and organisations whose activities pose a biosecurity risk must:

- take all reasonable and practical steps to prevent or minimise each biosecurity risk
- minimise the likelihood of causing a '[biosecurity event](#)', and limit the consequences if such an event is caused

SALEYARDS

The Prime Beef competition will be held at the Silverdale Saleyards, with thanks to Hayes & Co. All cattle must arrive at the Saleyards by 6:00pm on Wednesday the 5th August. All cattle will be weighed on this day on arrival.

The Prime Beef Auction will commence on Thursday 6th August from 1:00pm. Any cattle that remain at the Saleyards after the sale, hay will be fed at the buyers expense.

STOCK

Only Cattle tick free stock will be allowed entry to the grounds. EXHIBITORS REQUIRE THE FOLLOWING:

- National Vendor Declaration (Cattle) and Waybill, or Movement Record Document
- National Health Declaration Form – version 18/10/17

NSW Livestock owners can travel direct to the Saleyards and check their paperwork in with QDAFF staff or RNA appointed staff on entry. QDAFF staff will then inform NSW livestock owner, in writing, that they MUST contact Kirra Yards on 07 55364714 and inform them of their return journey 24 hours prior to leaving the Saleyards.

CATTLE TICK CONTROL

Exhibitors have a general biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable and practical steps to prevent or minimise the spread of cattle tick.

The RNA will allow exhibitors to have their animals inspected on property prior to entry to the Saleyards. All exhibitors who adopt to have their cattle inspected at home must use an accredited certifier and provide the accredited certifier details along with the treatment certificate on entry to the grounds.

All exhibitors must adhere to the regulation of ticks and animals must be treated within 24 hours of travelling to the Saleyards. The RNA will employ an accredited officer for cattle tick inspection on arrival for those who do not treat cattle on their properties. All procedures are to be carried out within guidelines of the Bio-security Act. All National Health Declarations will be forwarded to Bio Security for their clearance/permission to compete at 2020 Prime Beef Competition.

JOHNE'S DISEASE – for Bovine Johne's Disease

It is your General Biosecurity Obligation as the exhibitor NOT to knowingly spread the disease. Any Cattle from suspected herds that have not yet been cleared by Biosecurity Queensland will not be accepted on to the showgrounds.

Rules:

- Exhibitors must advise their Johne's Disease status at the time of entry.
- Exhibitors must not enter animal(s) which are reasonably known or suspected of being infected with Johne's disease, including animals which have been introduced with a significant likelihood of being infected.
- Exhibitors must supply a health statement/declaration that provides information about the health of the animal including Johne's risk. The health statement/declaration must not be false, incomplete or misleading.

PRIZE AWARDS
